AGREEMENT FOR ACCEPTABLE USE OF THE
ELECTRONIC SYSTEM

You are being given access to the District's electronic communications system. Through this system, you will be able to communicate with other schools, colleges, organizations, and people around the world through the Internet and other electronic information systems/networks. You will have access to hundreds of databases, libraries, and computer services all over the world.

The District wide area network will be used by staff and student to communicate with others in a manner that is consistent with the District goals. Student communications using networked resources will be considered publications and be governed by Board Policy regarding Student Publications.

Users should not expect that files stored on school-base computer will always be private. Administrators and faculty may review files and messages to maintain system integrity and insure that users are acting responsibly. The district reserves the right to inspect any material stored in files to which users have access and will edit or remove any material which the district staff, in its sole discretion, believes may be objectionable. Users of the computers/Internet will not use their account to obtain, view, download, or otherwise gain access to potentially objectionable materials. This includes text materials, video images, or sound files that may be considered objectionable.

Rules and regulations of system usage will be added and posted from time to time by the faculty/administrators of the district and/or the network. Users of computers/Internet are subject to these rules and regulations.

With this educational opportunity comes responsibility. It is important that you read the District policy, administrative regulations, and agreement form and ask questions if you need help in understanding them. Inappropriate system use will result in the loss of the privilege to use this educational tool.

Please note that the Internet is a network of many types of communication and information networks. It is possible that you may run across areas of adult content and some material you (or your parents) might find objectionable. While the District will take reasonable steps to restrict access to such material, it is not possible to absolutely prevent such access. It will be your responsibility to follow the rules for appropriate use.

RULES FOR APPROPRIATE USE

- You may be assigned an individual account, and you are responsible for not sharing the password for that account with others.
- The account is to be used mainly for identified educational purposes, but some limited personal use maybe permitted.

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- You will be held responsible at all time for the proper use of your account, and the District may suspend or revoke your access if you violate the rules.
- Remember that people who receive e-mail from you with a school address might think incorrectly, that your message represents the school's point of view.

INAPPROPRIATE USES

- Using the system for any illegal, commercial or political purposes is prohibited.
- Any use of a District account by anyone but the authorized owner of the account..
- Downloading or using copyrighted information without permission for the copy-right holder.
- Posting personal information about yourself or others (such as names, addresses and phone numbers).
- Deletion, examination, copying, or modification of files and/or data belonging to other users without their prior consent.
- Commercial software is placed on the computer for the use and convenience of students and staff. Any unlawful use such as the copying of copyrighted material without the express written permission of the owner or the proper license.
- Any unauthorized, deliberate action which damages or disrupts a computing system (including the willful introduction of computer "viruses" or other disruptive/destructive programs), alters its normal performance, or causes it to malfunction. Intentional attempts to "crash" network systems or programs are punishable disciplinary offenses.
- Posting messages or accessing materials that are abusive, obscene, sexually oriented, threatening, harassing, damaging to another's reputation, or illegal.
- Wasting school resources through the improper use of the computer or network system.
- Gaining unauthorized access to restricted J.I.S.D. information or resources pertaining to students or employees.
- The use of electronic mail in any manner that is contrary to District policy, including but not limited to the use of profanity or inappropriate language.
- Any use that disrupts the educational and administrative goals of the district.

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CONSEQUENCES FOR INAPPROPRIATE USE

- Suspension of access to the system;
- Revocation of the computer system account; or
- Other disciplinary or legal action, in accordance with the Student Code of Conduct and applicable laws.

This agreement must be renewed each academic year.
